





- Beloved in Christ, our Lord Jesus shed His almighty blood of each and every sin in our life. I, as called and ordained servant of Christ Jesus, forgive all your sins, in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit.
- Amen! I praise You Almighty Father, Son, and Holy Spirit for the Almighty Gift of Your forgiveness and Salvation. Now dear Lord, strengthen me anew to live my life in sincere repentance and walk according to Your Holy Word, in Jesus Name. Amen!

<sup>14</sup>The LORD God said to the serpent,

"Because you have done this, cursed are you above all livestock and above all beasts of the field; on your belly you shall go, and dust you shall eat all the days of your life.

<sup>15</sup>I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and her offspring; he shall bruise your head, and you shall bruise his heel."

13And again,

"I will put my trust in him."

P A reading from Luke, chapter 11.

<sup>14</sup>Now he was casting out a demon that was mute. When the demon had gone out, the mute man spoke, and the people marveled. 15But some of them said, "He casts out demons by Beelzebul, the prince of demons," 16 while others, to test him, kept seeking from him a sign from heaven. <sup>17</sup>But he, knowing their thoughts, said to them, "Every kingdom divided against itself is laid waste, and a divided household falls. 18 And if Satan also is divided against himself, how will his kingdom stand? For you say that I cast out demons by Beelzebul. 19 And if I cast out demons by Beelzebul, by whom do your sons cast them out? Therefore they will be your judges. <sup>20</sup>But if it is by the finger of God that I cast out demons, then the kingdom of God has come upon you. <sup>21</sup>When a strong man, fully armed, guards his own palace, his goods are safe; <sup>22</sup>but when one stronger than he attacks him and overcomes him, he takes away his armor in which he trusted and divides his spoil.


