CATECHISM REVIEW The First Petition


- **P** Hallowed be Thy name.

to those who were near. ¹⁸For through him we both have access in one Spirit to the Father. ¹⁹So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints

Sermon

Nicene Creed




