What is Truth?

In John 18:37-38, we read "Then Pilate said to him, "So you are a king?" Jesus answered, "You say that I am a king. For this purpose I was born and for this purpose I have come into the world—to bear witness to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth listens to my voice." Pilate said to him, "What is truth?"

With our world today, and so many competing ideologies, we may wonder what really is the truth. There is nothing new about this question. We can see since the fall of humanity this question arises again and again. Pontius Pilate asks that same question. During Pilate's time there was also so much political, religious, and societal corruption. As societies and nations rise and fall throughout time and throughout the world, the answer has always been the same. Jesus said in John 14:6, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

In John 8:31-32, Jesus said to the Jews who had believed him, "If you abide in my word, you are truly my disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

We are set free when we know that Heaven is our home, that Jesus Almighty's sacrifice forgives every sin of the repentant believer.

Jesus Christ teaches again and again that the Word of God is what is real truth.


Praying to His Heavenly Father on behalf of His disciples, He said this: "Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth" (John 17:17). Christ Jesus said the Word "cannot be broken" (John 10:35).

Moreover, the Word of God is eternal truth "which lives and abides forever" (1 Peter 1:23).

Do a Word Search in the Bible and note how many times of "Truth" occurs.

The Old Testament refers to the Almighty as the "God of truth" (Deuteronomy 32:4; Psalm 31:5; Isaiah 65:16).





This truth can be proven. Look at the newest picture (above) from the James Webb telescope. How did the Bible get this right? Psalm 8:3-4 "When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars, which you have set in place, what is man that you are mindful of him, and the son of man that you care for him?" (See also Hebrews 2:6) The Bible has always taught that without God we are truly insignificant. But with Him, our Almighty Creator, we have the gift of eternal life. Look what God can do. Time and space are not an issue for God. Praise and thank You, Jesus Christ, for You are Our Creator and Redeemer! (John 1, Colossian 1, Hebrews 1)

What is Truth? It is Jesus Christ and the forgiveness of sins, and strength to live each day through Him.

May we each be growing in that grace and truth.

"Thanks be to God for His inexpressible gift" (2 Cor. 9:15)! This is St. Paul's exclamation upon hearing the Corinthian church's response to the preaching of the Gospel of Jesus Christ and his request for support for the church in Jerusalem. The Christians in Corinth heard and received God's mercy in Christ, and they responded to St. Paul's call to support Christians in Jerusalem with a collection. The Corinthians' joy filled Jerusalem's need.

This is the reality of stewardship. Because of God's generosity in the giving of His Son to die on the cross for us, we are to be generous with all that we receive from Him. What do we receive? Everything. All that we are and all that we have is the Lord's. He is the creator and the giver. We are His creatures and those who receive what He gives.

It sounds easy. And it is. But then again it isn't. Stewardship is easy because it is God's work. Through what God gives, we give to others. Through what God gives, we support the work of the church for the life of the world. He gives; we receive. And like our generous Father in Heaven, we, as His

children, use what He gives to us to love and serve others.


But stewardship is also difficult. That is because it goes against our natural inclination to think that what I have is mine to do what I want with. This is our sinful nature. It is our selfishness and our greed. How can we who have been given everything — life, food, clothing, house, home, forgiveness, divine sonship, an eternal inheritance — be so stingy with what we give to the church, the place where we hear about and receive all that God gives us and does for us? We are all guilty of this kind of thinking. And the only godly response is to repent and trust in the Gospel.

For if God has given you His own Son, will He not give you all things? Yes. He will. This is His sure and certain promise. God provides for His people. He provides everything we need for this body and life and for the life that is to come.




