Have you ever visited the Statue of Liberty? The Statue of Liberty is gift of France and the brilliant work of sculptor Frederic Auguste Bartholdi, the Lady symbolizes basic American values of liberty and an opportunity for all people. Everyday ordinary citizens in both the United States and France had contributed their pennies, nickels, and dimes in the 1880s to make the Statue of Liberty a reality. Again, in the 1980s many across America contributed to refurbish and repair the statue. The festivities of Liberty Weekend in 1986 properly crowned this renewal project and reaffirmed the American dream of liberty for all. The Lady continues as a beacon in the harbor for all to see. The Statue also reminds us of the High Cost of freedom for it stands for so many who stood together against evil and tyranny throughout the life of our nation.

I was traveling through New York on the way to Israel and I caught only a glimpse of this beautiful Statue. It stood reminding me of the great blessing of freedoms and opportunity that we enjoy in America. We must always be prepared in our hearts, minds, and souls to realize it might not always be that way. Yet, we still thank God for what we have at this present moment. And may we all pray and strive to make that freedom endure for the next generation.

Today there is considerable security around this beautiful monument of freedom because of possible terror attacks. And at this time, with all the unrest within our country, some are worried that rioters may attack it.

To greater and lasting degree, we can daily in our hearts look up and visit the Cross of Jesus Christ and be reminded that we are liberated from the tyranny of the fear of death. We can daily be reminded we are free from fear of death because of the forgiveness of all our sins. The Cross can be founded so deep in and stand so high in our hearts to remind us that Jesus Christ took our place and punishment for us. The Cross also reminds of us of the High Cost of our freedom for the forgiveness of our sins. It cost God so deeply indeed, in every dimension of His Love. But in His Eternal Love, that



Psalm 33:12

is His Almighty Love, He gave up His one and only Son. This Love is for all of us. This love is for you personally. You can now rejoice because God forgives any honestly repentant sinner who relies on His Son for the forgiveness of His sins. You can be free and forgiven from anything that would chain or enslave your soul.

In celebrating liberty and freedom, we realize this does not mean that we can just do anything. We are not free to do evil. The Holy Spirit says in Galatians 5:1, 13-14, "For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery... you were called to freedom, brothers. Only do not use your freedom as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another. For the whole law is fulfilled in one word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself."

God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit, works together for our eternal freedom. When one ponders this truth, it is the greatest motivation to live and work together for the freedom and salvation of other souls. Like so many who worked together to gain and keep the freedom of our nation, God calls the church devoted to continually love and work together in tithing their time, talent and treasures for the work of Gospel of Jesus Christ.

As the Statue of Liberty still holds high freedom's light, we always hold high the Cross of Jesus Christ so that the Gospel light truly shines in our hearts, in our community, in our nation, and in the world. Praise God for the gift of freedom in our country we still enjoy at this particular time. However, praise God that no matter what the next years may bring we have freedom that cannot fade or fall. We have the much greater freedom and gift through Jesus Christ; the gift of everlasting freedom in Eternal Life! As Jesus says in John 8:36, "So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed"

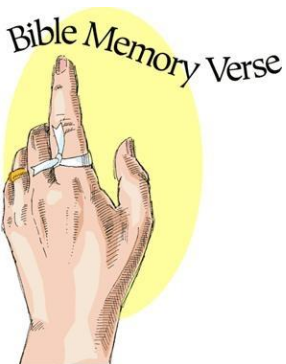

The Rewards of Godliness

It's no secret that you can't bribe your way into heaven. No amount of good works will impress God enough to open heaven's door for their sake. "For the wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23) and the person who "keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become guilty of all of it" (James 2:10). Rather, salvation is "the free gift of God ... in Christ Jesus" (Rom. 6:23).

So, your good works won't earn you the reward of heaven. But does that mean that there are no rewards at all? Consider what the Small Catechism says in the "Close of the Commandments":

What does God say about all these commandments?

He says, "I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, punishing the children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation of those who hate Me, but showing love to a thousand generations of those who love Me and keep My commandments." (Ex. 20:5–6)

What does this mean?


God threatens to punish all who break these commandments. Therefore, we should fear His wrath and not do anything against them. But He promises grace and every blessing to all who keep these commandments. Therefore, we should also love and trust in Him and gladly do what He commands. (SC II)

God promises to bless you in keeping His commandments. What might these blessings be? Well, consider what Paul says about keeping the Fourth Commandment: "Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. 'Honor your father and mother' (this is the first commandment with a promise), 'that it may go well with you and that you may live long in the land'" (Eph. 6:1–3).

And think about what your life would be like if you went around stealing (breaking the Seventh Commandment), telling lies about people (breaking the Eighth Commandment), and generally being cruel to those around you (breaking all the commandments!). That is obviously not a blessed way to live. In fact, you'd be miserable living that way.

And Jesus says more about what is in store for those who make sacrifices for His sake: "Jesus said to them, 'Truly, I say to you, in the new world, when the Son of Man will sit on His glorious throne, you who have followed Me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or children or lands, for My name's sake, will receive a hundredfold and will inherit eternal life'" (Matt. 19:28–29).

So don't grow impatient in doing good. Follow the Lord who has freely given you everlasting life.

Meeting Minutes Monday, June 3rd, 2024

Present: Pastor Love, Terry Seidler (President), Mike Baumann (Vice-President), Lillie McCulloch (Secretary), Phyllis Buch (Evangelism), Rod Dahlke (Elders), Cheryl Dahlke (Education), Barry Krenz (Trustees)

Vice-President, Mike Baumann called the meeting to order. Pastor opened with a prayer and devotion. Meeting minutes from April were reviewed. A motion for approval was made, seconded, and passed.

President - Terry has been working with the boards to stay involved with what is going on and would like to sit in on each board's meetings when time allows, to improve communications. A motion was made and passed for this to be allowed.

Trustees - The new air conditioner for the classroom region was installed last week by Stainless Specialists. The new tables are in use, old tables have been disposed of. A meeting was held with our insurance agent from Church Mutual, our new policy has better coverage for the expense. They are still waiting to hear if additional insurance coverage is needed for the stained glass windows. Bids have been collected from United Structures as well as Urban Construction for the proposed storage addition on the North side of the church. A second option would be to purchase an additional storage shed for the lawn mowing equipment and repurpose the existing shed. Additional future needs include repaving of the parking lot, church furnace system, office and classroom windows, wall paneling in classrooms, new copier, kitchen updates and outdoor sign replacement. It is planned to discuss and vote upon the storage situation at the annual church meeting.

Elders - A candidate to fill the vacant elder position has been selected, Rodney is seeking a motion to approve special appointment of Kyle Young to join the Board of Elders. A motion was made and passed. It was discussed to move the pancake breakfast to Oct. 20th or Nov. 10th and there was agreement among the elders to move the date to October 20th. Extra effort to publish this date change will be important, consider selling tickets already at the polka service.

Board of Education - VBS is next week, beginning to look ahead at Sunday School start dates.

Stewardship/Evangelism - VBS is next week. Pack the Pews Sunday will be held in conjunction with the polka service on September 29th, consideration for a simple luncheon (such as chili) afterwards to be discussed.

Pastor - Caleb Ney was confirmed June 2nd. Don Pankow (recently resigned elder) returned to his home congregation. Iron Sharpens Iron continues to go well and attendance is encouraged. VBS for both youth and adults next week. New member classes start the second week of September, planning for Thursday evenings at 6:30p, subject to change if needed. Discussion to address and update the prayer list as well.

Treasurer - Balance reports for April and May were reviewed, the ending balance for May was \$23,397.67.

Old Business - No old business to discuss.

New Business - Fill-in's during pastor's vacation include the following: Neely Owen on the 17th, Scott Holoubek on the 23rd/24th, and Dwayne Lueck on the 30th and 1st. The next regular council meeting is scheduled for August 12, 2024 at 7:30pm. There is a dual-parish meeting on August 13th.

A motion for adjournment was made, seconded, and passed. The meeting closed with a prayer from Pastor Love.

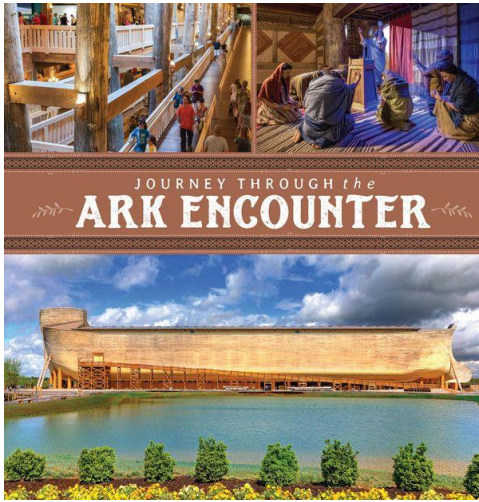

LUTHERAN SCHOOLS — JULY 1-15

The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) School Ministry serves as a national voice for Lutheran schools, upholding the standards of Christ-centered schools that are academically strong and respectfully operated. Nationwide, there are 1,992 LCMS schools, which include 1,127 early childhood centers, 778 elementary schools and 87 high schools.

Remember God's work in Lutheran schools as you pray:

1. for the children attending Lutheran schools, that their eyes, ears, hearts and minds would be open to God's Word.
2. for Lutheran school teachers, that they would correctly divide and deliver Law and Gospel to students through real-life applications each day.
3. for Lutheran school principals, who lead people to passionately embrace the witness our schools provide to the community. Pray that pastors, principals, directors and teachers would work together in God-pleasing unity.

4. for pastors, who champion the Kingdom work happening in our schools. Pray that pastors would be excited to be an integral part of their school's ministry and the teaching of the children.
5. for the ability of Lutheran schools to serve every child in their care. Ask that the Lord would provide the means to help schools serve children who have disabilities, who have experienced trauma or who come from families with limited resources.
6. for Lutheran schools that are struggling to fill empty seats. Pray that God would revitalize their ministries, energize their staff members and bring more children through their doors.

7. for parents who support our Lutheran schools with their time, talents and treasures. Give thanks for their dedication to the mission of the school.

8. for daily opportunities for our teachers and staff to show God's mercy, love and forgiveness both inside and outside of the classroom. Pray that God would maintain our ability to practice our faith in Lutheran schools.

9. for church members who tell the story of their Lutheran school, that their recommendation might lead more students through the school's doors.

10. for the many non-Christians and exchange students who are coming to our schools. Pray that God would work through the Gospel that they will have faith in Jesus.

11. for first-year teachers, that they may apply their gifts to demonstrate grace and mercy. Pray that God would give them strength and patience.

12. for our early childhood centers that introduce young families to the saving love of Jesus. Pray that they are a faithful witness to the littlest of God's children and their families.

13. for courageous Lutheran schools willing to take calculated risks that will result in significant rewards for students. Give the leaders of these schools wisdom in their decisions.

14. for comfort and healing for school faculty and students during times of injury, illness and loss.

15. for God to raise up wise and gifted leaders who are willing to serve in administrative roles at Lutheran schools.

CAMPUS MINISTRY — JULY 16-31

The challenges to Christians on our nation's college campuses are increasing exponentially. On practically every campus, objections are increasing to the biblical worldview, Christian doctrine, traditional ethics and moral practices. The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod's (LCMS) campus-ministry arm, LCMS U, aims to encourage, support and help students, faculty and staff in their response to these challenges so they can boldly bear witness to Christ.

Remember God's work through LCMS U as you pray:

16. for the 200-plus LCMS U chapters around the country, that they would receive the support they need to effectively reach out to America's college students.
17. that more congregations and individuals would become involved with their local LCMS U chapters or start new ones.
18. for the growth of LCMS U on urban campuses and at community colleges, two fertile mission fields. Pray that the Lord would open doors to the spread of His Word in these places.
19. for all the dedicated staff and volunteers involved in campus ministry, that God would energize them for their work and use them to plant seeds of faith that will continue to grow.
20. for students starting their first year of college, that they would find a church to attend,

Christian friends and make good decisions while living away from home for the first time.

21. for the parents of college students, especially those who have an empty nest for the first time. Pray that they would find joy and contentment in the midst of life's changes.
22. that Lutheran college students would be bold witnesses to their faith in Jesus Christ, even when faced with pressure from peers and professors.
23. that young people would hunger for the certain truth of the Gospel of Jesus Christ and not be deceived by the half-truths and lies of Satan.
24. for the 800,000-plus foreign students studying at American colleges and universities. Many come from countries where the Gospel is not freely preached. Pray that their time in the U.S. would provide the opportunity for them to learn about Jesus.



25. for the international students who came to faith while studying abroad. Ask the Lord to provide support so that they can continue to grow in their faith after they return home.

26. for busy college students, who are pulled in many directions with the demands of school, work, friends, family and other activities. Pray that they would make God a priority by setting aside time for worship, Bible study and Christian service.

27. for the development of campus-ministry programs at institutions of higher education around the world.

28. that God would bless and guide the work of all students

involved in mission work and volunteer opportunities both at home and abroad. Pray that this time would be a blessing to them and others.

29. with thanksgiving for a new school year. Pray that students and campus-ministry workers would return refreshed and with renewed dedication.

30. for recent college graduates, that they would find gainful employment as well as a church home where they can learn about God's holy Word in all of its truth and purity.

31. for all students, that God would protect them and provide people to share with them the Word of God.

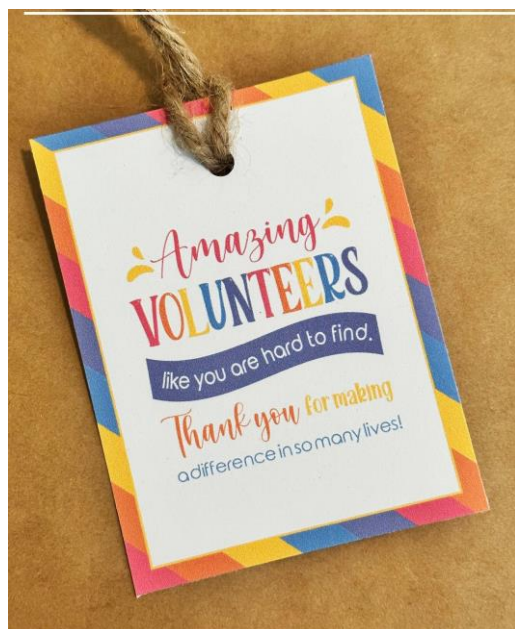
