Dear Brother's and Sister's in Christ,

In Love God calls us to behold all of His Holy Word. That is not easy in a world that is so addicted to its own desires and dedicated to its own definitions of love.

Yet, the Love of the Holy Spirit is clear and repeated. It says: John 14:16 "If you love me, you will obey what I command." And 1 John 5:2 "This is how we know that we love the children of God: by loving God and carrying out his commands.", I John 5:3 "This is love for God: to obey his commands." Again in 2 John 6 "And this is love: that we walk in obedience to his commands."

The motive is always love from God's forgiveness in Christ Jesus and love for God in Christ Jesus. For God loved us first. 1 John 4:10 "This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins." Our Loving Savior Jesus leads us to share the true Love of God is this fallen and passing world. Jesus teaches this over and over again. He said in John 13:35 "love one another: just as I have loved you, you also



are to love one another. ³⁵ By this all people will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

You are doing such a great job of this and I would like to thank

you for doing so and encourage you to continue to do great work in these actions of Love.

Following is a great article on welcoming people into the church. You are doing many of these suggestions already. The list below contains additional ideas that you might not have tried, or maybe just need to refresh in doing them. We all need a Savior. We all have a Savior in our Resurrected Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. Remember everyone is going through trials that no one knows about. God wants us to remember this and encourage one another. We remember when we show love to others Christ considers it showing love to Him.

REMEMBER: The command to love one another is found 14 times in the New Testament.

HERE ARE 21 SUGGESTIONS:

- TRY TO GREET EVERYONE including members you don't know. AT LEAST try to say good morning or good evening, or wave or give a smile.
- 2. Every church MEMBER is a host and not a guest. Making visitors feel welcome is primarily the responsibility of members, not the NEBULOUS "church."
- 3. The most important person for a visitor to talk to in order to feel at home in a new church is YOU. It is not the pastor, or the greeter, but a regular member.
- 4. Treat first time visitors as guests of God, not strangers.
- 5. Look people in the eye and SMILE.
- 6. Take the initiative, don't wait for others to initiate conversation with you. Introduce yourself.
- 7. Learn people's names and try to remember them.

 (However, the average person forgets someone's name is less than 90 seconds. So do not be hard on yourself. And do not avoid the person because you have forgotten their name way too many times. Just keep being friendly and throughout the years you will eventually remember their name.)

- 8. Don't just talk to those you know or to relatives. Remember that every member of your church is part of the family of God, your family. You might not feel the need to reach out but others need your love and friendship as part of the family of God.
- Ask questions and learn about your guests and others you don't know. For example, "Do you live here in..... ? Have you always lived here?"
- 10. Listening is a very effective way to show love. Give them your full attention.
- 11. Remember that some people are introverts so try not to come on so strong that they feel uncomfortable
- 12. Also greet children
- 13. Let children be children. (crying, playing, singing!) and don't expect them to be grown-ups.
- Leave the designated back pews for people with small children so they can leave the Sanctuary without being embarrassed.
- 15. Invite visitors to the fellowship meal, Bible Study, etc.
- Help visitors find seating that suits the needs of their family

- 17. Help first time visitors by being their tour guide and helping them find worship resources. Visiting a new church is like a cross-cultural experience, even for those of us who have visited dozens of other churches.
- 18. Invite people to fill out your church's visitor registration card or guest book.
- 19. Tell people you're glad they are here.
- 20. Pray for them throughout your week.
- Remember how Christ has loved you and cares about you. Imitate Jesus' love. Imagine how Jesus would greet every person.

We all need love and encouragement. When you reach out to others to encourage them it can be a blessing to you as you wrestle through all life's struggles.

As in Love we hold to all of God's Holy Word, praise God for His Love and sharing that Love with those in the world around us.

Whose Is It Anyway?

If you have every bought or sold a house, you are acquainted with the concept of a "title search." Before you can sell your house, and before anyone else will feel comfortable putting down the money to buy it, you have to prove that you really own it. So a title company looks through the public records to ensure that you bought it from the person who really owned it, who bought it



from the person who really owned it before that, all the way back to the earliest records of your state, including when your state was only a territory or colony of England.

Peak into a preschool classroom during playtime and you'll see a simplified version of this. A child starts playing with a ball, but another child says, "That's mine: I had it first."

You can't understand the Seventh Commandment without understanding this concept of ownership or title. As the Small Catechism puts it:

You shall not steal. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.

Your neighbor's possessions are *his*: you don't have a right to take them. And likewise, your possessions are yours. Ownership and property rights are foundational to any functioning society.

But there is something deeper to know about ownership, and that is the question of who has the title and ownership to you? Paul says, "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price" (1 Cor. 6:19–20).

If you yourself are owned by God, then of course everything that you own, you really only possess by God's leave: all of it, at bottom, belongs to Him since *you* belong to Him. For you were bought with the blood of Christ.



This notion is the foundation of all Christian stewardship. It all belongs to God. It should all be used for things that bring honor to His name, blessings to our neighbors and the extension of His kingdom.

Faith Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes

Monday, April 8th, 2024

Present: Pastor Love, Terry Seidler (President), Mike Baumann (Vice-President), Lillie McCulloch (Secretary), Bonnie Grueneberg (Evangelism), Rod Dahlke (Elders), Cheryl Dahlke (Education), Barry Krenz (Trustees)

Vice-President, Mike Baumann called the meeting to order. Pastor opened with a prayer and devotion. Meeting minutes from February were reviewed. A motion for approval was made, seconded, and passed.

President - There is a vacant elder position that needs to be filled, the position's term ends in 2026. The council is to appoint an elder to fill this position per the bylaws. Terry would like to work with Rod to discuss this with members to compile a list of men willing to take on the position, with the intention to present a name to appoint at the next council meeting. Terry was able to meet with past-president Mike to review to-do's, and scheduling the dual-parish meeting is still in the works.

Trustees - Barry provided updates on continued maintenance of the building. All exit signs have been updated/replaced as indicated and all have battery backup as well. The trustees are in the process of collecting estimates to replace the air conditioning units. Urban Construction and United Structures are providing estimates for a 32ft x 36ft addition to the north end of the church. Grounds cleanup will start when spring arrives. Barry has an upcoming meeting with our insurance representative from Church Mutual to review current policies and potential changes. Lawn mowing services for the church and cemeteries are arranged for the summer.

Elders - Rodney provided a brief update, elders are looking ahead to VBS and assisting with the program. The idea was also proposed to compile an updated church directory, information to be collected via survey - bulletin insert or postcard. Pastor proposed working on an entirely new directory (including pictures), it has been 7 years since the last photo directory update.

Board of Education - Sunday School ended on Palm Sunday.

Stewardship/Evangelism - Currently collecting supplies for Gospel TLC & Haven House, Easter cards were sent out to all the shut-ins, and a 100th Birthday celebration was held for Mabel Marquardt. The new website is coming along very well, Bonnie anticipates it will be live for public viewing by the end of the week. The Ark Encounter trip planned for November 1st-3rd overlaps the annual pancake breakfast. This is a circuit-wide trip with multiple churches involved, so the best option would be to reschedule the pancake breakfast (many who assist with the breakfast will likely be on the trip). October 20th or November 10th have been proposed as potential reschedule dates for the pancake breakfast, the elders will discuss if either of these dates are a feasible option. Sleep in Heavenly Peace build is June 29th, Bonnie proposed that we fundraise to sponsor several beds - the goal being \$1000.

Pastor - Confirmation Class starts May 19th, there is currently 1 confirmand. Iron Sharpens Iron had a great turnout once again and Pastor continues to encourage attending bible study as well.

Treasurer - Balance reports for February and March were reviewed, the ending balance for March was \$30,099.08.

Old Business - No old business to discuss.

New Business - Provide appreciation gifts for the Sunday School teachers (Patti & Cheryl). The next regular council meeting is scheduled for June 3, 2024 at 7:30pm.

A motion for adjournment was made, seconded, and passed. The meeting closed with a prayer from Pastor Love.



LCMS MISSIONARIES ON HOME SERVICE - MAY 1-15

Every other year, The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod's (LCMS) international missionaries spend approximately two months in the United States on "home service." During this time, they reconnect with the individuals, congregations and groups who support their mission work. Home service also gives them a period of rest and renewal and the chance to spend time with their families.

Remember God's work through missionaries on home service as you pray:

- for the LCMS missionary families who will be on home service. Ask the Lord to keep them safe during their travels.
- for God's hand to guide and bless the details and logistical arrangements that are a necessary part of missionary home service, such as transportation and housing.
- for missionary families to be able to visit as many congregations and other groups as possible, while managing their limited time in the United

- for the Lord to guide missionaries as they prepare their presentations. Ask Him to help them to share their stories and ministry news with those who have so faithfully supported their ministry.
- 5. for missionary families. Pray that God would give emotional, physical and spiritual strength as they travel, share with supporters and meet new friends.
- for missionary children. Pray that God would provide them with the opportunity to know that they are a vital part of their family's ministry.
- that many congregations all over the United States would

welcome missionaries into their churches for mission presentations, Sunday school, children's messages, celebration luncheons, Bible studies and other activities.

- 8. that congregations and other groups would experience a revitalized interest in praying for missionaries and supporting their work, especially after visiting with them face-to-face and hearing about what God is accomplishing through them.
- 9. that as missionaries share their experiences, the listeners would consider serving as a missionary themselves — in a short-term, longterm or career capacity.
- 10. for the families of visiting missionaries, that they would enjoy their time together and mutually encourage one another.
- 11. for God to comfort and sustain the missionaries who are not able to see family and friends in the United States this year. May the

Holy Spirit comfort them with His presence and assurance of God's calling to serve far from home.

- 12. that missionaries would have an easy transition back to life in the United States even for a short time during home service with minimal effects of reverse culture shock.
- 13. that the Lord would raise up supporters for missionaries who are struggling to finding the resources necessary for their ministry.
- 14. with thanksgiving for the many forms of support and the joys the Lord provides to mission ary families as they serve Him.
- 15. that the conversations started during home service would continue long after the missionary has returned to the mission field. Pray that through ongoing communication, missionaries and supporters would encourage one another.

MAY Pray For Us Calendar

PARTNER CHURCHES - MAY 16-31

The LCMS has 38 partner churches around the world. A partner church is a church body with which the LCMS has full altar and pulpit fellowship. Many LCMS partner churches also are members of the International Lutheran Council, a worldwide association of confessional Lutheran church bodies. Some LCMS partner churches came into existence through LCMS-supported mission efforts, while others have historic roots that pre-date the LCMS or that are sourced in the mission efforts of other Lutheran church bodies.

Remember God's work in His Church as you pray:

- 16. for all LCMS partner churches, some of which only have a handful of congregations. Pray that they would never feel alone in their service to Christ, and His Church.
- 17. for LCMS partner churches in Latin America and the Caribbean. Pray that God's Word would continue to spread throughout these countries to bring the Body of Christ together in fellowship and to be witnesses to His love.
- 18. for LCMS partner churches in Africa. Pray that God would strengthen Lutheran Christians in this region to carry out their work for His name's sake.
- for LCMS partner churches in Asia, that God would guide and strengthen Lutheran Christians

in this region, especially in areas where it is difficult or dangerous to do His work.

- 20. for LCMS partner churches in Eurasia. Pray that God would continue to use His Word as a light to those in darkness and as a stronghold for the life of His Church.
- 21. with thanksgiving for all the missionaries who serve partner churches, that they would remain faithful in their tasks and be witnesses to the Gospel through acts of mercy.
- for those who serve in leadership positions in LCMS partner churches around the world, as they guide, nurture and shepherd their people.
- for the laypeople of LCMS partner churches around the world, that they would be fulfilled by God's Word and Sacraments.



- 24. that God would continue to raise up faithful servants for His Church in locations around the world.
- 25. for the Lutheran church bodies around the world interested in fellowship with the LCMS. Pray that God would guide the consideration process according to His will.
- 26. In thanksgiving for those who pray continually for those who serve where spreading God's Word is difficult or dangerous.
- 27. for Lutheran churches around the world that are dealing with strife between their members. Pray that the Lord would guide them to a peaceful resolution that would strengthen their witness to the community.
- 28. for the Lutheran churches in Eurasia as they seek to minister

- to the refugees in their midst. Pray for safety for both the church workers and the refugees.
- 29. for all projects currently going on in LCMS partner church bodies, that each one would have the volunteers and resources necessary to carry out the work of the church as it shows mercy and provides physical and spiritual care for people around the world.
- 30. for safe travel between and within countries in each world region. Pray that pastors, missionaries, medical teams and all who travel to assist partner churches would be kept safe and healthy, that the Gospel might be proclaimed to the far corners of creation.
- 31. for all those still living in darkness, that the Gospel will be their light and life.
