

October is the month in which we celebrate the Reformation. One of the main tenants of the Reformation is getting the Bible back into the hands of people. The Bible was written not just for a select few to read and interpret. It was written for all to hear, read and study (Psalm 119:105; Acts 17:11; 1 Thess. 5:27; 1 Timothy 4:5; 2 Timothy 3:15-17; Colossians 4:16).

Every time you open the Bible you open up a gift from God. God's Word itself proclaims in Hebrews 4:12-16

"For the word of God is living and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight. Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of him to whom we must give account. Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has gone through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet was without sin. Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need."

If you want a faith that is true, a faith that will last, an Enduring Faith that has strength and zeal, you yourself must be consistently studying the word of God. It will cut right through all the difficult issues that you are personally facing in your life. It will penetrate right through all the hurt and pain, exhaustion and exasperation, frustrations and fatigue that all souls experience.

The devil will put up every wall and throw every temptation and obstacle in the way for you to be personal mediating on the Holy Scriptures.

One of those temptation is that "I have done it all. I know it all." Reading the Bible is like breathing. One can never say, "I have breathed enough. I do not need to breathe any more. I have grown past breathing." If you stop breathing you will slowly be starved of the life given oxygen that empowers your body to have health and energy. So it is with your faith. No



matter how much you have learned, no matter how much you may think you know continue to dig deeply into the Bible for yourself.

Dr. Martin Luther writes in the Large Catechism concerning the 3rd Commandment: "Let me tell you this. Even though you know the Word perfectly and have already mastered everything, still you are daily under the dominion of the devil, who neither day nor night relaxes his effort to steal upon you unawares and to kindle in your heart unbelief and wicked thoughts against all these commandments. Therefore, you must continually keep God's Word in your heart, on your lips, and in your ears. For where the heart stands idle and the Word is not heard, the devil breaks in and does his damage before we realize it. On the other hand, when we seriously ponder the Word, hear it, and put it to use, such is its power that it never departs without fruit. It always

awakens new understanding, new pleasure, and a new spirit of devotion, and it constantly cleanses the heart and its meditations. For these words are not idle or dead, but effective and living. Even if no other interest or need drove us to the Word, yet everyone should be spurred on by the realization that in this way the devil is cast out and put to flight, this commandment is fulfilled, and God is more pleased than by any work of hypocrisy, however brilliant."

If you want to cast out the devil with all his dominating, depressing, and destructive temptations in your life constantly nourish your faith with the word of God (Matthew 4:4; John 4:31-34), daily dress yourself with the Word of God (Ephesians 6:10-18), and daily live with the Word of God (Colossians 3:16). For a true faith that stands the test of time, and completes the race of faith open up God's gift to you every day and dig deeply into it.

From LCMS Stewardship Ministry



Lutherans have historically been called "the singing church." There is no doubt that music has been a major component in the theology and practice of the Lutheran church. Luther once remarked about music, "We can mention only one point, namely, that next to the Word of God, music deserves the highest praise." Music has a power and purpose that cannot be understated in our worship and the life of the congregation.

But music does more than touch the emotions. Music is a vehicle that carries both the musician and the hearer deeper into connection with the truth of the Scriptures. This is true of the most complex Bach chorale and even the simplest of songs like *"Jesus Loves Me, This I Know."* Each musical selection within the church shapes the thoughts, minds and faith of the people who experience them.

This is also true of stewardship hymns. We are currently considering the verses of *"Forgive Us, Lord, for Shallow Thankfulness"* (*LSB* 788) as it shapes our understanding and practice of stewardship. This month we take a deeper dive into verse two:

Teach us to thank you, Lord, for love and grace For life and vision, for a purpose clear, For Christ Your Son, and for each human face that shows Your message ever new and near.

The stanza begins by touching on the truth of the Law. Thankfulness is not a natural posture for fallen humanity. For sinners curved in upon themselves, thankfulness for love and grace is something that must be taught. We are those who hoard and clutch. Our confession of our shallow thankfulness highlights the need for us to learn thankfulness to God.

Thankfulness also points to what we are stewards of: love and grace! All the things we have traditionally called stewardship aren't actual stewardship. Rather, what matters is how we steward the one, true and only treasure: the love and grace of God revealed to us in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. So, all stewardship is stewardship of the Gospel! How can we gaze at the cross and empty tomb and not be thankful?

The LCMS defines stewardship as "the free and joyous activity of God's family — the church — in managing life's resources for His purposes." God's love and mercy give us a clear purpose as we live out our Baptism and practice this joyous stewardship. All we are, all we have entrusted to us, and all we are called to do is to connect others with the love and mercy of God revealed in Jesus!

The faithful steward sings with lips and life of this love and mercy that is ever new and near. In the Scriptures. In the Lord's House. At the Lord's Table. This is where our stewardship song starts and ends. Our family, our co-workers and classmates, and our world need to hear this song!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus our Lord,

Halloween can be a time a fun. God want us to have fun but He does not want us to be foolish. The Holy Spirit often teaches to stay away from the alluring deception of magic, séances, Ouija boards, witchcraft, and other supernatural games. As we celebrate Reformation this month and getting back into the Holy Scriptures, please note what those beautiful Scriptures continually and so repetitively teach, especially in the last days in the Book of Revelation. Again, what is God's very deep feelings and warning about this topic?

Leviticus 19:31 "Do not turn to mediums or seek out spiritists, for you will be defiled by them. I am the LORD your God."

Deuteronomy 18:9-13 "⁹ When you enter the land the LORD your God is giving you, <u>do not learn</u> to imitate the <u>detestable ways</u> of the nations there. ¹⁰ Let no one be found among you who sacrifices his son or daughter in the fire, who **practices divination** or **sorcery**, **interprets omens**, **engages in witchcraft**, ¹¹ or **casts spells**, or who is a **medium** or **spiritist** or **who consults the dead**. ¹² Anyone who does <u>these things is detestable to the LORD</u>, and because of <u>these detestable practices</u> <u>the LORD</u> your God will drive out those nations before you. ¹³ You must be blameless before the LORD your God."

2 Kings 9:22 "<u>How can there be peace,"</u> Jehu replied, "as long as all the idolatry and witchcraft of your mother Jezebel abound?"

2 Chronicles 33:6 "He sacrificed his sons in the fire in the Valley of Ben Hinnom, practiced sorcery, divination and witchcraft, and consulted mediums and spiritists. He did much evil in the eyes of the LORD, provoking him to anger."

Ezekiel 13:18-20 "¹⁸ and say, 'This is what the Sovereign LORD says: Woe to the women who sew <u>magic charms</u> on all their wrists and make veils of various lengths for their heads in order to ensnare people. Will you ensnare the lives of my people but preserve your own? ¹⁹ You have profaned me among my people for a few handfuls of barley and scraps of bread. By lying to my people, who listen to lies, you have killed those who should not have died and have spared those who should not live. ²⁰ "Therefore this is what the <u>Sovereign LORD says: I am against your **magic charms** with <u>which you ensnare people</u> like birds and I will tear them from your arms; I will set free the people that you ensnare like birds."</u>

Micah 5:12 "I will destroy your witchcraft and you will no longer cast spells."

Nahum 3:4 "all because of the wanton lust of a harlot, alluring, the mistress of **sorceries**, who enslaved nations by her prostitution and peoples **by her witchcraft.** "

Acts 19:18-20 "¹⁸ Many of those who believed now came and openly confessed their evil deeds. ¹⁹ A number who had <u>practiced</u> <u>sorcery</u> brought their scrolls together and burned them publicly. When they calculated the value of the scrolls, the total came to **fifty thousand drachmas**. ²⁰ In this way the word of the Lord spread widely and grew in power." (50,000 days wages – They gave them all up because they were detestable to God.)

 for sponsors, that they might faithfully work with parents to teach the faith to the baptized. for all the baptized, that in daily repentance all might cling to God's promises of forgiveness and eternal life in Christ. for all the baptized, that they might daily cling to their Baptism and hope in Christ alone.

 for all the baptized, that they witness to all about the death and resurrection of Jesus.

THE LORD'S SUPPER - OCTOBER 16-31

Bread and wine, body and blood feed us with the food that endures to eternal life. Christ gives His body and blood to His body the Church. Those who have faith in the words, "given and shed for you" receive what those words promise, the forgiveness of sins.

Remember God's gift of the Sacrament of the Altar as you pray: 16. Thank God for the Sacrament of the Altar, that it is the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ under the bread and wine.

 Rejoice that in the Sacrament forgiveness of sins, life and salvation are given. 18. That God would grant us faith in His Word, that we worthily receive the Sacrament and live in repentance. Thank God for daily bread, even the bread of life that we receive in the Sacrament. 20. for preparation before receiving the Sacrament, that all might receive it trusting in the Words of Christ.

21. Thank God for the Church and the Office of the Holy Ministry.

22. for the unity of the *Church*, that schisms might cease, and all might be united in the true faith.

23. that we, who are many, may see ourselves as the one Body of Christ. 24. for the Church, that she remains faithful to the truth of God's Word. 25. for the LCMS, that we might believe, teach and confess all things according to God's will.

26. with thanksgiving that God continues to strengthen us through His Word and Sacraments. for those who do not belong to the Church, that God would call all to faith. **28.** for the sustenance of the Sacrament of the Altar, that God would grant faith unto eternal life.
