# Stewards, Called to Forgiveness

Human beings were created and redeemed to be stewards. Bearing the image of God (Gen. 1:26–28), the steward was created to reflect the Creator within creation. In a way, stewards are simply mirrors. Mirrors cannot do anything to the image that is placed in front of them.

A mirror was the first item in creation that embodied the computer term GIGO. "Garbage in, Garbage out." In a computer, if you enter good data, you get a good result. You enter bad data; you will get a garbage result.

In photography, you can run an image through a filter, which can remove imperfections. Myriad apps allow for the option to cut people out, add people in and change backgrounds all in an attempt to make the perfect image. Mirrors cannot do that. They do not provide anything new. Mirrors are created to reflect, not process, an image. They simply reflect the person standing in front of them.



Stewards are like this. Created to reflect, a steward will reflect the God in front of them. The steward will either reflect a godly stewardship that holds that God is the owner of all things (Ps. 24:1) and is the One to whom they are accountable, or they will reflect the god of self and see the created order as something to be possessed, used, and in far too many cases, abused. It is not a question of IF the steward reflects, it is really a question of WHO is being reflected.

For this reason, the *Lutheran Service Book* has included a necessary hymn worthy of meditation: "Forgive Us, Lord, for Shallow Thankfulness" (*LSB* 788). Its first verse reads:

Forgive us, Lord, for shallow thankfulness, For dull content with warmth and sheltered care, For songs of praise for food and harvest press, While of Your richer gifts we're unaware.

This is a fitting call to repentance for every steward. Our thankfulness is so often shallow. We get comfortable with the overflowing blessings we have entrusted to us by the Lord. These trusts are so many that the steward often forgets the One who entrusts them. Worse, with so many physical trusts evident, the steward loses sight of the greatest trust: the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The failed steward sees so much plenty that they lose sight of the treasure: Jesus!

So, we confess our shallow thankfulness. In absolution, the imperfections of the failed steward are wiped away and a new image is sent into the world. We release our hold on stuff. We rethink our relationship with the created order and recall that it is all to be used FOR JESUS! This keeps the richer gifts in view, for us and for those we know and love who need Jesus.

**Treasurer/Financial** -A report for January through June 2024 was included in the meeting packet. The final report indicated a total income of \$133,136.42, expenses of \$123,611.35, and income less expenses of \$9,525.07. A motion was made, seconded and passed to approve the minutes.

**Audit -** The audit report indicated everything is reconciled, all bills have been paid in a timely manner and records were well organized. A motion was made, seconded and passed to approve the reports.

The floor was opened up for Q & A and discussion. A motion was made to move forward with the Urban Construction estimate and start the process to have the addition built. This motion was seconded and passed.

Bonnie Grueneberg has 2 years worth of DVD recorded services and bulletins, she is looking for guidance on the necessity to keep these or if they can be disposed of. Yvonne Duwe recommended looking into record keeping rules/guidelines/protocols for churches before moving forward.

Nominations are open for Circuit Visitor. A motion was made, seconded and passed to nominate Pastor Gillet of Tomahawk.

A motion to adjourn was received, seconded and passed.

Pastor Love closed with a prayer and led members with the Lord's Prayer and singing of the doxology.

<u>Present:</u> Pastor Love, Terry Seidler (President), Mike Baumann (Vice-President), Lillie McCulloch (Secretary), Barry Krenz (Trustees), Cindy Braatz (Treasurer) and Jim Beilke (Elders).

Vice-President, Mike Baumann called the meeting to order. Pastor opened with a prayer and devotion. Meeting minutes from June were reviewed with one correction made. A motion for approval was made, seconded, and passed.

<u>President</u> - A gentleman is requesting to view records of the church, Terry is wondering what the protocol should be for such a request. Guidelines were discussed and agreed upon within the council (no photos to be taken, no copies to be made, and documentation kept of all information he leaves with. The dual-parish meeting is tomorrow evening (8/13/24) at 6:30pm. The church ball games are done and ran smoothly and successfully.

<u>Trustees</u> - One of the air conditioners went out due to a bad condenser. Stainless Specialists was able to repair the unit. The new building addition is moving forward through Urban Construction, the next step is removing trees and completing the dirt work to prepare the space. A cemetery plot was sold in the north cemetery. Bruce Pfingsten is working with the trustees to start replacing the lights in the church, beginning with the kitchen. Other routine maintenance work continues to take place. They are still waiting to hear back on additional insurance for the stained glass windows in the church.

<u>Elders</u> - The new elder, Kyle Young, is working out very well. The service schedule has been set for September and reviewed; no service on Labor Day, polka service on 9/29/24 at 10am with chili luncheon to follow. October 20th will be the pancake breakfast, it was decided to not have communion that day to simplify things. Pricing for tickets will remain the same as last year (\$10/\$5). It was brought up to open a 'Church Addition Fund' so donations may be made towards that expense.

Board of Education - No update provided.

<u>Stewardship/Evangelism</u> - Chili luncheon sign-ups will be out after labor day. The plan is to set up tables and chairs Saturday morning prior. School supplies are currently being collected. There will be a fifth Sunday collection coming up, the donations will go to the Klade family. It is being discussed to purchase banners or signs of some sort with biblical verses/sayings to hang on the ball diamond fence during next years' season. There are currently 30 people signed up to attend the Ark Encounter trip at the beginning of November.

<u>Pastor</u> - Recent funerals - Cindy Luedtke and Scott Pfaff. The Labor of Love went very well. The dual parish outdoor worship service went well, 102 people attended the luncheon afterwards. The circuit forum will be held at Trinity on 9/22/24 at 1:30p if we'd like to send representatives. Pastor Joel Danner is stepping down as a circuit visitor.

<u>Treasurer</u> - Balance reports for July were reviewed, the ending balance for July was \$49,622.56. There was no report provided for June, Terry will contact Sharon to receive that report.


Old Business - No old business to discuss.


Faith and St. John's have a new joint parish logo.


Rejoice in God's goodness in Christ as you pray:
