### May God Grant You A New Year!

Another New Year - another chance at life, another chance to make a difference, another chance to experience something that you have never done before. A New Year is a new opportunity to discover, to explore, to grow, to mend, to improve, to look forward to new possibilities.



God has given you another New Year. What sins of the last year have been wiped away by the powerful love and blood of Jesus Christ. You are a forgiven child of God. ### Faith Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes Monday, December 9, 2024

Present: Pastor Love, Terry Seidler (President), Mike Baumann (Vice-President), Lillie McCulloch (Secretary), Barry Krenz (Trustees), Cindy Braatz (Treasurer), Bonnie Grueneberg (Evangelism), Rod Dahlke (Elders), Cheryl Dahlke (Education).

Vice-President, Mike Baumann called the meeting to order. Pastor opened with a prayer and devotion. Meeting minutes from October were reviewed with one correction made. A motion for approval was made, seconded, and passed.

Trustees - New LED bulbs were installed in the kitchen and secretary's office, next will be the office and classrooms on the East side. The remaining bulbs will be purchased next year. Tony Gruetzmacher will be plowing snow again and Dennis Hummer will be sanding the parking lot as needed. The church recently had a fire inspection which went well.

President - Terry reviewed the constitution in preparation for the upcoming Annual Meeting. Positions up for re-elect and collecting names for nominations were discussed. Keith Wendt was appointed to fill the vacant spot on the Board of Elders for the remainder of Jim Beilke's term beginning February 1st, 2025. Term to end January 2026. A motion was made, seconded and passed. Locating the list of possible greeters for scheduling was discussed. The National Youth Gathering will be in July of 2025, Terry is considering attending with the group this year. Pastor Ruhbusch called to offer funds to purchase items for the altar guild.

Elders - Since the last meeting the Elders reviewed their budget, which came to \$107,960. There was significant expense with guest speakers this year, primarily in paying out mileage. Going forward the plan is for some of the Elders to step up to cover non-communion services when needed.

Treasurer - Balance reports for October and November were reviewed, the ending balance for November was \$47,447.17.

Board of Education - The childrens' program will be this Sunday, December 15th. There are 4 confirmands and 7 children that will be participating. Caroling will be this Sunday at 1pm. Stewardship/Evangelism - The Angel Tree is up and all the tags have been claimed. Christmas bags are ready to be assembled. Bonnie is compiling a list of members/stops for caroling this Sunday. The Ark Encounter was a great success!

Pastor - Iron Sharpens Iron is still going well, there were 8 attendees at the last gathering. The Ark Encounter went well. Advent services have started, attendance was low at the first service, likely due to inclement weather. A new laptop was acquired at a great price, under budget. It will be up and running by the next meeting. Jessica Pfaff was baptized and is now officially a church member

Old Business - No old business to discuss.

New Business - The Annual Meeting will be January 26th, 2025. A budget meeting will be held January 13th at 7:30pm to review all the budgets prior to the Annual Meeting.

Barry brought up the significant expense increase with our copying company. Pastor proposed decreasing the number of copies by 25% now, and then reassess to possibly decrease further in the future. It will be encouraged for couples to share bulletins and to reference the big screens instead of bulletins when possible.

Rodney reviewed the itemized Elders' budget with the council which totalled \$107,960. A motion was made, seconded and passed.

The next dual-parish meeting is set for Tuesday, January 14th at 6:30pm.

The next regular council meeting is scheduled for February 10, 2025 at 7:30pm.

A motion for adjournment was made, seconded, and passed. The meeting closed with a prayer from Pastor Love.

Epiphany is from a Greek word meaning to "reveal" or "make manifest." The season of Epiphany is our time to focus on the revelation of who Jesus is – both true God and true man – as we remember Christ's revelation to the Gentiles in the visit of the Wise Men.

## Give thanks as you pray:

 That God would make us bold witnesses to the Good News of Jesus Christ in this new year and always.  For opportunities to witness to friends, family members and strangers. Please send Your Holy Spirit to give us wisdom and faithful words to use during these encounters.  For our congregations, that God would strengthen them by fostering a faithful Lutheran approach to confessing Christ to neighbors and planting daughter congregations.

4. That our schools would be faithful mission outposts, reaching unchurched families with the Gospel and strengthening the faith of churched families.

 With thanksgiving for all the Synod's faithful church workers, that they might be re-energized daily and find great joy in their service.  That just as You made known Your Son to the Gentiles through the leading of a star, You would continue to bring the light of Your Gospel to the hearts of all people.  For new church plants and mission starts, that the Lord would help faithful congregations sprout up in every corner of the United States.

 That we would be effective in reaching out to people of different ethnicities who are living in our communities. Pray that the Lord would use us

as His instruments to make the LCMS a reflection of the Church Triumphant.  For those marching for life, whether at the National March for Life in Washington, D.C., or a pro-life event closer to home. Please pray that all those who attend might be a powerful witness to others.

10. For all children, that they would be brought to the saving waters of Baptism and raised in the love, nurture and admonition of the Lord.

That the Lord would help us raise our children and young people in the faith, always pointing them to the hope and salvation found only in Christ. 12. 
