"Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." - Philippians 4:6-7

November is the month to celebrate Thanksgiving. Kim and I are so very thankful to be able to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ with God's family here in God's country of Wisconsin. We want to thank you for your generosity, kindness and support through Kim's chemo treatments. What a joy it is to know that we all have a common Savior who forgives all our sins and brings people together from all over the world as brothers and sisters in Christ!

The Holy Spirit teaches us to be thankful because thankfulness is an empowering personal habit. Scripture teaches this again and again, and again and again science proves it. Here are three examples.

A few years ago Dr. Nick Stinnett of the University of Nebraska conducted a group of studies called the

"Family Strengths Research Project". Stinnett and his researchers identified six qualities that make for strong families. The first quality and one of the most important to be found in strong families was the quality of appreciation. Families that are strong are strong in part, Dr. Stinnett concludes, because family members express to each other their appreciation for what the other members DO and for who they ARE

In a similar study, another researcher looked into the effect of praise in the workplace. His study showed that the ratio of praise to criticism in the workplace needs to be four to one before employees feel that there is a balance - that there must be four times as much praise as there is criticism before they feel good about their work and about the environment they are in

That is pretty staggering information - information that tells us that if we want to do something good, that if we

want to have a healthy family, a strong workplace, other any effective group that we need to sure that appreciation, praise, and thanksgiving are heard at least four times as often as is criticism.



Again Dennis Prager, author of "Happiness is a Serious Problem" writes: "There is a 'secret to happiness," Prager writes, "and it is gratitude. All happy people are grateful, and ungrateful people cannot be happy. We tend to think that it is being unhappy that leads people to complain, but it is truer to say that it is complaining that leads to people becoming unhappy. Become grateful and you will become a much happier person."

This is a keen observation, and Holy Scriptures knew this fact and has taught it for thousands of years. The Judeo-Christian tradition places such emphasis on thanking God. The liturgy is filled with expressions of gratitude. "It is good to give thanks to the Lord," begins the 92nd Psalm.

Why? Because God needs our gratitude? No: because we need it. Learning to be thankful, whether to God or to other people, is the best vaccination against taking all the good things in our life for granted. And the less you take for granted, the more pleasure and joy life will bring you.

The most beautiful blessing of all, worthy of all praise and thanksgiving, is the gift of the forgiveness of sins and the gift of eternal life that we have in the Son of God, Jesus Christ our Lord. Each and every day this Gospel is offered to us. Each and every day we can receive it and give thanks to God for the beautiful gift that cleanses away all our sins. (I John 1:7; 5:13).

What Makes for a Cheerful Giver?

St. Paul wrote to Church of Christ in Corinth: "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor. 9:7). God loves a cheerful giver. But who is a cheerful giver?

Abel was. By faith, he gave the firstborn of his flock, and it was acceptable in God's sight. Abraham was. By faith, he prepared cakes and a tender choice calf for God and entertained angels unaware. So also were David and Solomon. By faith, David would not make a sacrifice to God that cost him nothing, so he paid Araunah his due. By faith, Solomon built a house for God, where his name would dwell and thereby where He would dwell to be Israel's God and they His people.

What more shall we say? For time would fail us to tell of all those who gave not simply for the joy of giving but for the joy of knowing the One to whom they gave.

So also our Lord, who for the joy set before Him, gave everything – yes, even His life – enduring the cross and scorning its shame. He gave to the shedding of His blood, willingly and resolutely setting His face toward Jerusalem to die for the life of the world. Though He was rich in every way, He became poor, so that by His poverty, we might be rich beyond measure.

So then, let us like Abel and Abraham, like David and Solomon, and even like our Lord Jesus Christ, give cheerfully to God for the work of His kingdom in our midst. Like them, let us decide in our heart for the joy set before us. It's the joy of knowing the One to whom we give is the One who gives us all good things.

Forty-Three Years of Flipping Pancakes

Faith Lutheran Church, 15425 Highway K South, Merrill, will be hosting their 43rd annual all you can eat pancake dinner on Sunday, November 2 serving from 11 a.m. – 1 p.m. Homemade potato pancakes and buttermilk pancakes, of course, are the main entrée served with breakfast sausages, scrambled eggs, locally produced maple syrup, applesauce, cheese and several dessert options.

Tickets can be purchased at the church ahead of the pancake dinner as well as at the door. Adults are \$10 per person, children 6-12 are \$5 and children 5 and under are free. Carryouts are also available.

A Bake Sale is also being sponsored by the Evening Women of Faith before church and during the dinner. The tables of homemade baked goods are a must to check out.

The pancake has a long history and was first recorded in 600 BC in ancient Greece from poetic writings. More familiar, Pancake Day became a traditional way to use up dairy products before lent. In 1100 AD, the pancake breakfast was born. In 1445, villages in the United Kingdom started a famous pancake race in Olney, Buckinghamshire. Over the years, fresh snow had been used to seemingly make pancakes light and fluffy. Milk and sometimes cream became the preferred liquid for pancake batter replacing brandy and wine which were first common. In the late 1870s, the flapjack became known as the pancake in American with maple syrup becoming the preferred topping of choice.

In more recent years, 1995, the largest pancake ever flipped was also in the United Kingdom. It measured 16.4 yards across and weighed 3 tons. Certainly more than a frying pan was needed to flip it over. Other records have been set for flipping pancakes such as in 2009, Aldo Zilli set a world record for flipping a single pancake 117 times in 60 seconds. Several years later, 890 people set a world record for the most people tossing pancakes – 930 people tried byt 40 flippers were disqualified for dropping their cakes.

With 43 years of hosting the pancake feed, pancakes will be flipping with ease on Sunday, November 2 at Faith Lutheran Church. All are welcome!



Faith Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes Monday, October 13, 2025

<u>Present:</u> Pastor Love, Terry Seidler (President), Mike Baumann (Vice-President), Lillie McCulloch (Secretary), Barry Krenz (Trustees), Cindy Braatz (Treasurer), Bonnie Grueneberg (Evangelism), Rod Dahlke (Elders), Karen Kleinschmidt (Education). Vice-President, Mike Baumann called the meeting to order. Pastor opened with a prayer and devotion. Meeting minutes from August were reviewed. A motion for approval was made, seconded, and passed.

<u>Treasurer</u> – The balance reports for August and September were reviewed, the ending balance for September was \$20,209.96. All bills have been paid in a timely manner.

<u>Board of Education</u> – Sunday school is going well and Christmas program details are in the works. The children's service will be December 14th. No further updates at this time.

<u>Trustees</u> – Light fixtures are still being upgraded as time allows. A fire inspection was recently completed which showed that our range hood in the kitchen needed an official cleaning inspection. The inspection was completed at the cost of \$125 and is valid for one year. There has been two additional burials at the Scott Cemetery. About a dozen headstones have been straightened recently as well. Propane costs for heating this winter have been locked in at \$1.48 with France Propane Services, they will also donate the 200lb propane tanks for the pancake breakfast as well.

<u>President</u> – The upcoming Veterans Service with breakfast is at St. Johns, our church will host a Veterans Service as well without a meal. No further updates.

Elders – Things are going well and everything is managed. The Pancake breakfast is coming

<u>Stewardship/Evangelism</u> - Polka service & pots-blessing was very successful. All food items were donated so there was no out of pocket expense. \$1,150 in donations was raised and donated to the Klade family. The Angel tree is coming up and details are being worked out.

<u>Pastor</u> – The district conference is coming up next week in Eau Claire, Oct 20-22nd. Pastor was recently contacted by a woman seeking financial assistance for an additional 4 days in a motel during a time of significant financial difficulty and instability after major life events. Her situation seems legitimate, after discussion Pastor will collect additional information and proceed with due diligence. If everything checks out, we will assist her with another 4 days in a hotel. Faith does not have any confirmands this year, but confirmation class is going well.

<u>Old Business</u> - Bonnie is still working on making contact with Living River. The Christmas Stars trip is set up and registration is open.

<u>New Business</u> - It is a good time to start scouting members to fill positions that will be coming up for election in the new year. Bonnie will start figuring out a schedule to get the Christmas tree and decorations up in the church. Additionally, a reminder that committees should be working on their budgets so they are finalized at the time of our December meeting.

The next regular council meeting is scheduled for December 8th, 2025 at 7pm. The budget will be covered at this time as well. A motion for adjournment was made, seconded, and passed. The meeting closed with a prayer from Pastor Love.




